Photogrammetry at ZTEX Owner Richard L. Ortiz led the integration of Photogrammetry technology and the construction industry at ZTEX. Mr. Ortiz first utilized drones in 2007, primarily for the ZTEX Marketing Department. In 2017, he began adapting drone equipment for civil engineering and surveying. Mr. Ortiz dedicated many days and nights researching various programs and applications, to determine the best fit for company needs. He ensured that the Engineering, Marketing, and IT

Departments were all a part of the final development of this cutting-edge technology. The hard work and perseverance Mr. Ortiz displayed kept Marketing Director, Priscilla Rodriguez motivated. She stated that Mr. Ortiz challenged them to learn about different software, mobile apps, and different drone models. The ZTEX IT Department built a Super Computer for a faster processing time, at half the price of purchasing one from a retail vendor.

Engineering Supervisor, Jesus Araujo uses Photogrammetry and GPS Units to pinpoint site elevation and required cut & fill for the earthwork. Using Photogrammetry produces a faster result and provides vivid details, easier to identify errors and changes. Mr. Araujo never expected to use drones on

a day-to-day basis, let alone in the construction industry. He crosschecks the results with Topographic Surveying, giving an average accuracy between .06ft. to .10ft. This software has saved the company time and money, through reducing surveying time by 75% and providing more time for our crews to begin production. Once finalized, the data is entered into AutoCAD, which gives our Project Managers access to create production goals. The Photogrammetry images are also developed into 3D Progression Models.

All information is then double, triple, and even quadruple checked before being finalized. Since Accounts Payable Administrators Valerie Castillo and Rosie Burciaga are familiar with the process of purchase orders and invoices at ZTEX, they know exactly what to look for when finalizing payments.
